

GETTING STARTED

Share one small way you saw God at work in your life this week.

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What signs of hope do you see as this chapter opens (v.1-3)?
- 2. As it is harvest time, how long until Naomi and Ruth can grow their own food? In the meantime, how will they meet their most pressing need?
- 3. What initiatives do Naomi, Ruth, Boaz and his men take to meet this need? What law about "gleanings" is Boaz heeding (Lev. 19:9-10)?
- 4. What do you most admire about Boaz in this part of the story? What do you most admire about Ruth here?
- 5. "As it happened..." Share about a time when you saw the providence of God in your own life. What did you learn through that experience?
- 6. Is there an area in your life where you're ready to move to the next chapter? Why?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Father, thank you for caring so deeply for us. We want to honor you with our whole lives, so help us turn away from anything that's preventing us from being close to you. Help to develop our character so we may look more like you. Help us to see all the ways you're moving in our lives today. In the name of Christ, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Ruth 2:1-14 and Lev. 19:9-10. When have you shared Naomi's experience of God using a Ruth to show his kindness to you (v.11-12)? How did this unmerited act of kindness change you? Who do you know who needs to be reminded that God still loves them? What will you do today to demonstrate such love?

"Now there was a wealthy and influential man in Bethlehem named Boaz, who was a relative of Naomi's husband, Elimelech. One day Ruth the Moabite said to Naomi, 'Let me go out into the harvest fields to pick up the stalks of grain left behind by anyone who is kind enough to let me do it." Naomi replied, 'All right, my daughter, go ahead.' So Ruth went out to gather grain behind the harvesters. And as it happened, she found herself working in a field that belonged to Boaz, the relative of her father-in-law, Elimelech. While she was there, Boaz arrived from Bethlehem..."
