REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Look at the four stages of this reconciliation process Jesus outlines. Why not go public right away?
- 2. What does this passage say about the importance of counsel through others? Of accountability to a trusted few?
- 3. How easy or difficult is it for you to address a matter directly with another person?
- 4. Look at vs. 18-20. How do these verses relate to the other verses in this section?
- 5. Where might Jesus be calling you to speak to another person and apply this principle?
- 6. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Lord Jesus, thank you for the ways that you trained your disciples so long ago. Help us to follow your instructions and communicate well with others. You are our Leader, our Guide, and our Friend. Thank you for all that you have given to us. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

<u>GOING DEEPER</u>: Read Matthew 18:15-20 and Matthew 7:3-5. How are these passages similar and different? What is the role of other believers in our lives? How do you respond when others bring something to your attention? What does Jesus want you to hear?

"If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back. But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses. If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won't accept the church's decision, treat that person as a pagan or tax collector... I tell you this: if two or three of you agree here on earth concerning anything you ask, it will be done for you."
