

GETTING STARTED

Who is the keeper of your family stories and traditions? When are they shared?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. People in Biblical times did not have universal access to Scripture. How did they learn the Biblical stories and laws?
- 2. What does the Psalmist want future believers to know and not forget about God? (v.7)
- 3. What would happen if the next generation forgets? Whose responsibility is it to see that they remember?
- 4. Share about a time in your life that you helped with Kids Ministry. What is the best part of serving with children?
- 5. "We have to care even if they are not our kids." Redeemer places a high value on teaching our kids and youth. Why is this important? How can you help?
- 6. We leave a legacy by the faith we share. How important is it to you that your faith not only makes your life better, but reach those who will be here after you're gone?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Lord God, thank you for the privilege to share your Word with children. They are a joy and delight! Help us to remember this responsibility and respond with gratitude to help share Your Word. Keep us focused on leaving a legacy of faith. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

<u>GOING DEEPER</u>: Read Psalm 78: 1-8 and Deuteronomy 6: 6-9. What are the similarities and differences? Who passed the baton of faith to you? Who will you invest in at this stage in your life? What lesson would you like to pass along to the next generation?

We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the Lord, about his power and his mighty wonders.
