FACING YOUR GIANTS



Message: ATTITUDE

Text: 1 Samuel 17:17-26

BIG IDEA: CARRY OUT SMALL ASSIGNMENTS WITH A WILLING SPIRIT

“One day Jesse said to David, ‘Take this basket of roasted grain and these ten loaves of bread, and carry them quickly to your brothers. And give these ten cuts of cheese to their captain. See how your brothers are getting along, and bring back a report on how they are doing.’ David’s brothers were with Saul and the Israelite army at the valley of Elah, fighting against the Philistines. So David left the sheep with another shepherd and set out early the next morning with the gifts, as Jesse had directed him.”

I Samuel 17:17-20

MY NOTES:

GETTING STARTED

How do you feel when someone casts doubt on your ability to do something?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What small assignments was David tasked with? How did he embrace them with passion? How did this set him up to be used by God in a greater way than imagined?
2. In this text, why should David have been intimidated? Why wasn’t he? What do you tend to be intimidated by?
3. What “giant” or challenge are you facing in your life right now? (job demands, financial pressure, health/fitness, strained relationship, etc.). What do you need the most for the battle you face?
4. How do you push through intimidations? How do you move forward in faith when uncertainty is your greatest intimidator?
5. “Passionate people will fight to the finish in the battles that matter the most.” What battles are you tempted to give up on? What is your motivation to keep going?
6. How did David’s attitude affect his ability and anointing? Why is your perspective on a problem so important?
7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Lord God, strengthen us for the battles and challenges that face us right now. We ask for your courage and your attitude. May we trust and depend on your power at work within us. In the name of Christ, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read I Samuel 17:1-26. What does Goliath’s armor and weaponry reveal about him? (v.4-7) As an Israelite, how would you have viewed Goliath’s proposal? (v.8-10) Who would you “volunteer” from your small group to accept his proposal? Why?
