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

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Do you know anyone who is extremely talented, has a physical challenge that works against them, and must accomplish their talent in spite of their challenge?
- 2. Has their physical challenge made them weaker or stronger? Has their physical challenge made their talent even better? Do you believe that God has allowed the physical challenge to exist in their lives to move them to faith in action?
- 3. Like Naaman (vs. 11-12), have you ever made up a story in your mind to satisfy your heart about what would happen next?
- 4. Have you ever built-up expectations in your mind and then been disappointed when things didn't go as you expected? What does that do to your faith?
- 5. Does building-up expectations ever happen the way you expect them to happen? What is the danger of creating expectations in your mind?
- 6. When you consider the role the servant girl played in this account (II Kgs 5:3) how important was her faith in changing the life of Naaman?
- 7. How did Elisha encourage Naaman to put faith into action?
- 8. When you consider the role the servant of Naaman played in getting Naaman to go to the Jordan River (II Kgs. 5:13), how important was his insights at that moment. Who were more important in this account, the people with authority (Naaman, Ben-Hadad, Jehoram), or the slave, the servant and the prophet?
- 9. What was the importance of the Jordan River in healing Naaman? What was the importance of Naaman knowing there was a prophet in Israel? What was the importance of Naaman knowing there is no God in all the world except in Israel? How did that knowledge change Naaman's world view?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Lord, help us to surrender completely to your will in our lives and not create false narratives that hinder our trust in you. Help us to know that you are totally in control of our lives and have our best interest in mind. Help us to surrender completely to your will in our lives and not rely on our expectations, but trust completely in the way you work your will into our lives, thinking, and hearts.

"But his officers tried to reason with him and said, "Sir, if the prophet had told you to do something very difficult, wouldn't you have done it? So you should certainly obey him when he says simply, 'Go and wash and be cured!'" So Naaman went down to the Jordan River and dipped himself seven times, as the man of God had instructed him. And his skin became as healthy as the skin of a young child, and he was healed!

2 Kings 5:13-14

MY NOTES:

GOING DEEPER: Read 2 Kings 5:17 How did Naaman's healing change his understanding of God? How did Naaman's healing not change his understanding of God? Was God still only the God of Israel and not the God of the whole world? Was God pleased to move Naaman's faith that one step forward? Does God do the same with us?
