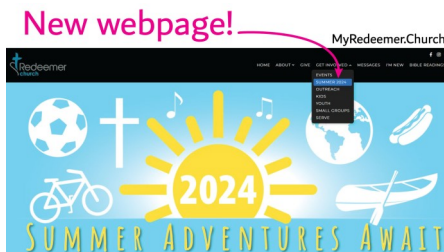

MESSAGE: EASTER CHANGES EVERYTHING Mar 31, 2024
Text: John 20: 1-18 Pew Bible page: 901-902

BIG IDEA: WHEN JESUS CALLS YOUR NAME, NOTHING ELSE MATTERS

“Early on Sunday morning while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved... Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. They were both running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He stooped and looked in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he didn’t go in.” v.15—“Dear woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?” She thought he was the gardener. “Mary!” Jesus said. John 18:1-5, 15-16 (NLT)

GETTING STARTED

Growing up, what was your favorite thing about Easter?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How do you think Mary was feeling on her way to the tomb that morning? Why did she visit the tomb so early?
2. What do you think was the disciples’ general reaction to Mary’s news of an empty tomb?
3. Would you have responded more like Mary or like the disciples that day? Why?
4. Why didn’t Mary recognize Jesus at first?
5. Mary recognized Jesus when he said her name. How has Jesus spoken your name in a time of grief or trial in your own life? What did it mean to you?
6. What evidence do you have that Jesus is alive today? What gives you Easter joy and hope?
7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, you are our Lord and King forever! Thank you that you defeated death for all eternity and now prepare a place in heaven for all who believe. You know us by name, you know our story, and you care for us always. As we believe in your resurrection power, may it change our lives and our thinking to trust you for impossible things. In Jesus’ name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read John 20:1-18. Compare this section with the other gospel accounts of Easter Sunday (Mt. 28:1-15, Mk. 16:1-11, Lk. 24:1-12) What similarities and differences do you see in each account? What details or commentary does John include? Why? How does the Resurrection account help you understand Jesus’ mission and message in a new way?
