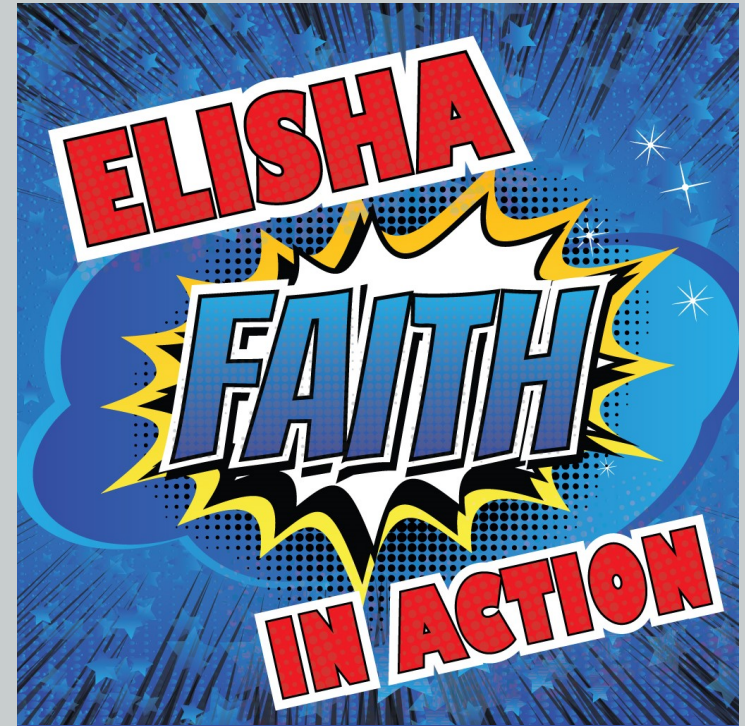

MESSAGE: AMAZING PROVISION

Text: 2 Kings 4:1-7

BIG IDEA: STOP WAITING FOR WHAT YOU WANT AND START WORKING WITH WHAT YOU HAVE

“One day the widow of a member of the group of prophets came to Elisha and cried out, ‘My husband who served you is dead, and you know how he feared the Lord. But now a creditor has come, threatening to take my two sons as slaves.’ ‘What can I do to help you?’ Elisha asked. ‘Tell me, what do you have in the house?’ ‘Nothing at all, except a flask of olive oil,’ she replied. And Elisha said, ‘Borrow as many empty jars as you can from your friends and neighbors. Then go into your house with your sons... Pour olive oil from your flask into the jars, setting each one aside when it is filled.’ So she did as she was told... Soon every container was filled to the brim!’
2 Kings 4:1-6

MY NOTES:

GETTING STARTED

As a kid, what did you do to make a little money?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why would this widow turn to Elisha?
2. What does Elisha’s response to the widow tell you about him? (i.e. compassionate, felt responsible for her, willing to help, open to being used by God)
3. Why did Elisha ask her what she had in her house? Why did she obey? What were her alternatives?
4. Why do you think the oil stopped flowing?
5. In what way can you relate to this story? What are you feeling low on right now? (i.e. energy, peace, time, patience, cash, etc)
6. If your faith was a jar of oil, how would you describe it currently? (i.e. bone dry, running low, just enough for each day, being replenished, full and overflowing)
7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Lord God, thank you for Elisha’s care for this widow so long ago. Thank you for your provision for our lives when we overwhelmed. Fill us up in ways that only you can do by your Holy Spirit. May we be ready to be poured out in service to you. In Jesus’ name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read 1 Kings 17:7-16 and 2 Kings 4:1-7. How is this story like Elijah with the widow at Zarephath? What are the similarities and differences? When has the Lord provided for you in an unusual way? Where is He calling you to be obedient right now?
