## **GETTING STARTED**

What was your favorite season as a child? Why? Which is your favorite now?

## **REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. In the list of opposites (v.1-8), what is the Teacher describing about current life and the control we have over it? What do you appreciate about these verses?
- 2. What is "the burden God has laid on man" (v.10)?
- 3. What does it mean to "set eternity in the hearts of men" (v.11)? Toward what end does all of this point? (v.14-15)
- 4. What things to you typically seek to control? What might it look like to surrender control in one of these areas?
- 5. How would you summarize the point the Teacher is making in this chapter?
- 6. Does belief in God's sovereignty free you to enjoy life? How so? Or why not?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

**PRAYER:** Lord God, thank you for this passage which reminds us of all the stages of life. We acknowledge that You are in charge of all things, including the various seasons that come and go. May we find our daily joy and meaning in knowing that you hold our days in your hands. Help us to trust in your leadership as the Master Builder. In the name of Christ, we pray, Amen.

**GOING DEEPER:** Read Ecclesiastes chapter 3. Is there a "time" phrase that particularly relates to where you are in life right now? At what "times" do you doubt that God is in control? How do you respond to those who act as if there is no God or final judgment? How does the promise of eternal life help you deal with injustice?

"For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven. A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant and a time to harvest... A time to cry and a time to laugh. A time to grieve and a time to dance... A time to tear and a time to mend. A time to be quiet and a time to speak. A time to love and a time to hate. A time for war and a time for peace. V.11—God has made everything beautiful in its own time. He has planted eternity in the human heart, but even so, people cannot see the whole scope of God's work from beginning to end."
