

GETTING STARTED

When you were a child, what was the home remedy for a cold?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. How do you picture the setting of this story (v.2-4)? The noises? The atmosphere?
- 2. How do you think the man in this story felt? (i.e. helpless and dependent, bitter and angry, discouraged and depressed, resigned)
- 3. How do you think the man felt when Jesus asked him: Do you want to get well? (i.e. insulted, cared for, challenged, mocked, hopeful, cynical)
- 4. "You cannot change what you are willing to tolerate." How have you experienced the truth of this statement?
- 5. What excuses do you tend to use most to avoid dealing with your problems?
- 6. What ongoing issue is God speaking to you about today? How has this issue affected you? What step could you take this week to start the process of healing or change?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Jesus, thank you for taking the time to go to the pool of Bethesda, a very hopeless place. You provided hope and healing. Help us to turn to you in the midst of our problems, instead of making excuses. Help us to trust you in faith for a solution. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read John 5:1-30. Why were the religious leaders so upset in this story? How do you suppose they responded to the healed man's testimony (v.15)? How did Jesus' response to the Jewish leaders only heighten their opposition (v.17)? Why would Jesus do this? How does this describe what Jesus came to do?

"Afterward, Jesus returned to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish holy days. Inside the city, near the Sheep Gate, was the pool of Bethesda, with five covered porches. Crowds of sick people—blind, lame, paralyzed—lay on the porches. One of the men lying there had been sick for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him and knew he had been ill for a long time, he asked him, 'Would you like to get well?' 'I can't, sir,' the sick man said, 'for I have no one to put me into the pool when the water bubbles up. Someone else always gets there ahead of me.' Jesus told him, 'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk!' Instantly, the man was healed! He rolled up his sleeping mat and began walking!"
