Big Idea:

ATTITUDE IS EVERYTHING

GETTING STARTED

In high school, who were two of your best friends? What was one quality about them that stands out to you?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. In "Attitude is everything." How does your attitude toward work/school affect the words you say there, how you interact with others, and how you resolve conflict?
- 2. How does the attitude and words of others around you at work/school affect you?
- 3. Think of a time when you wish you had been "quick to listen" and "slow to speak" in your work/school arena. What did you learn from this experience?
- 4. Which aspect of Christ's character do you most need to clothe yourself with from Colossians 3 (below), in relation to your employer, employees, co-workers or fellow students at school?
- 5. What is the most challenging aspect for you of God-honoring words in your current work or school environment?
- 6. How can you be intentional about your language this week—to build up and encourage, even those you disagree with?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, you are the One who brings people together in perfect unity, even when we come from different cultures and backgrounds. Help us to use our words to build bridges with those at work/school who might have a different perspective on life. May we be a faithful example of your encouragement and wise words. Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Colossians 3:1-17. These are words that Paul writes to the early Christians, people from different cultures and walks of life, learning to get along with one another. Which verses stand out to you the most here? Why?
