GETTING STARTED

Share a fond childhood memory of your parents or other adult. What makes this special for you?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Who and what are the commandments and decrees intended for? Why does Moses emphasize these points? (6:1-3)
- 2. Why such a strong emphasis on teaching these laws and decrees to kids? (v.6-9) How would you describe this method of teaching?
- 3. Share about a time when someone helped you get to know Jesus better. What did he/she say or do that made an impact?
- 4. Read Galatians 6:7. What spiritual seeds are you planting right now? How might those seeds impact generations to come?
- 5. "We can't force our kids to love God, but we can place them near people and in experiences that increase the likelihood of spiritual growth." How are you working to be a Christ-centered family?
- 6. Think of someone in your life who is younger than you. What are some ways you could intentionally invest in that person(s) this week?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Lord God, thank you for being a good Father to us, and leading us to become more like your Son every day. Please show us how we might lead younger generations to get to know You better by how we live and how we love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Deuteronomy chapters 5-6. The first four commandments (5:7-15) concern our relationship with God. What do they say about the kind of relationship God wants with us? The final six commandments (5:16-21) concern human relationships. What do they say about the kind of relationships God desires for us? How does 6:4-5 relate to the first four commandments?

"These are the commands, decrees, and regulations that the Lord your God commanded me to teach you. You must obey them in the land you are about to enter and occupy, and you, your children and grandchildren must fear the Lord your God as long as you live... Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength. Commit yourselves wholeheartedly to these commands that I am giving you today. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed, and when you are getting up."
