

GETTING STARTED

What is your experience with the fruits of the Spirit? Did you memorize them as a child or sing a song about them growing up?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What two things are in conflict with each other (v.17)? If we are made alive by the Spirit, why do we still struggle with sin?
- 2. How can you and God's Spirit weed out the sinful nature and grow the fruit of the Spirit in your daily life?
- 3. Which spiritual fruits (v.22-23) are blossoming in your life? Which do you struggle with the most?
- 4. What is the biggest change that being a Christian has made in your life?
- 5. "Keep in step with the Spirit" (v.25) Share an example of when you felt ahead or behind where the Holy Spirit was leading in your life. What happened? What did you learn?
- 6. What part of the message was most impactful for you? What can you learn from Kyle's story of his calling to ministry?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Holy Spirit, thank you for your work in our lives. Cultivate in us the fruit of the Spirit. May our lives exhibit your characteristics on a daily basis. Help others to see Jesus through us. May we keep in step with you, and your leading, not too fast or too slow. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Galatians 5:1—6:10. This was one of Paul's first letters to the early church. Why does he talk here so much about loving and serving each other? What is he trying to communicate or build in that culture? What can you learn and apply to your own life?

"So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants... These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions. V.22—'But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control... Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to the cross and crucified them there. Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives."
