DIVE DEEPER

◇ What experiences have you faced that are extremely difficult to offer forgiveness to the offender?

READ Luke 23:34 (NIV):

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

◇ How can we say the same thing to the jerks in our lives when they know exactly what they're doing? How do we forgive them? Do we have to forgive them? They're not asking for forgiveness. Does that get me off the hook? If they don't want forgiveness from me, then obviously I'm under no obligation to grant them forgiveness, right?

√ What is **ignorance**, really?

√ Look again at Yes & No statement number five: Did the Son of God actually forgive people who refused to ask Him for forgiveness--at a time when they were intent on destroying Him?

◇ How does Christ's example on the cross help us move from Resentment to Regret, and finally to Resolve?

◇ How many people are necessary in order for forgiveness to take place? Two? Every person involved? One?

READ Luke 6:27, 28 (NIV)

27 "But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, 28 bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."



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DIVE DEEPER (CONTINUED...)

◇ Did Jesus allow people to walk all over him? How did Jesus demonstrate a genuine love for his enemies?

ACTION STEPS:

1. What do I need to do to grant forgiveness to the greatest offenders within my life? How can I move from Resentment to Regret to Resolve?
2. Go through your personal list and experience the power of granting a full pardon to those who have caused you pain.
3. Christ said to be as wise as a serpent and gentle as a dove. How does your resolve match that with the people you have pardoned?
