OBITUARY

Dennis S. Schroeder passed away in his home on February 18, 2026, at the age of 98. Dennis was born in Dolton, South Dakota, in 1928. Dennis graduated from Mountain Lake High School, MN, and earned a B.A. from Mankato State College with a certification to teach high school science. He went on to teach in Waseca, MN, and then 30 years in Mound, MN, retiring in 1990.

Dennis and Margaret had 4 children (Kent, Lynne, Becky and Corinne). As a family they had many adventures, traveling across the U.S., visiting national parks, camping, canoeing in the Boundary Waters, fishing many Minnesota lakes and visiting family.
