

## **“GO DEEPER” QUESTIONS**

- The Matchbox Car story illustrates that confidence in the giver creates confidence in the ask. Can you think of someone whose character made it easy for you to ask for help? How does that experience shape the way you approach God?
- The sermon argues that disappointment with God often comes from expecting promises He never made. What are some things people commonly expect from God that He has not actually promised? What has God clearly promised every believer?
- David repeatedly asks God to change him, not just change his circumstances (Psalm 51:10). When you pray, do you tend to ask God to fix your problems or to transform your heart? Why do you think that is?
- David believed God would forgive him because he trusted God's character more than he trusted his own performance. Why is it sometimes easier to believe God loves others than to believe He still loves us after we've failed?
- The sermon concludes that "Big faith isn't asking for everything. It's asking for what God has already promised to give." What is one promise of God you need to pray with greater confidence this week, and what would it look like to actually believe He wants to answer that prayer?

Key Verse: Psalm 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God. Renew a loyal spirit within me.
