4. Jesus’ first words to the disciples were not about their failure, but about His authority. Why do you think Jesus begins the Great Commission by saying, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me”?
5. The sermon says, “You can’t Go without first Following.” What is the danger of trying to serve, lead, or make disciples without first being formed as a follower of Jesus?
