Main thought:

God commands us to practice rejoicing in order to help us respond to His protection, provision, power, and perspective.

The 5 books of Moses

| 4. | Numbers | Direction |
| 5. | Deuteronomy | Destination |

The 3 major festivals

- 1. Festival of Unleavened Bread (<u>Passover</u>) vv. 1-8
- 2. Festival of Weeks (**Pentecost**) vv. 9-12
- 3. Festival of Booths (<u>Tabernacles</u>) vv. 13-15

The practice of rejoicing

- 1. Look **back** to where you were
- 2. Look **around** to see what God has given to you
- 3. Look **how far** you've come by God's grace

The practice gives perspective

- 1. **Societal** (vv. 18-20)
- 2. **Sensual** (v. 21)
- 3. **Spiritual** (v. 22)

- Read verse 14-17. What were the additional commands for the festivals? Why were they important?
- Share with the group what comes to mind from your own life when you think about the 3 aspects of rejoicing shared on Sunday:
 - 1. Look back to where you were
 - 2. Look around to see what God has given to you
 - 3. Look how far you've come by God's grace.
- How does the practice of rejoicing give perspective when it comes to society, sensuality, spiritually? (vv. 18-22)
