

# THE 60-DAY DISCIPLE-MAKING CHALLENGE

## June 1 – August 1

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### Why Are We Doing This?

Over the past several weeks, we have studied what it means to make disciples.

We've learned from 1 Thessalonians that effective gospel ministry involves words, power, the Holy Spirit, conviction, and relationships. We've also learned that disciple-makers are bold like warriors, faithful like servants, gentle like mothers, instructive like fathers, and patient like Jesus.

Now it's time to move from learning to doing.

Philippians 4:9 says,

"What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—**practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.**"

The goal of this challenge is simple: between now and August 1, intentionally disciple one person.

## Step 1: Choose One Person

### BE BOLD LIKE WARRIORS

Prayerfully identify one person you can invest in over the next two months.

Possible people include:

- A new believer
- A struggling believer
- A friend
- A family member
- A coworker
- A neighbor
- Someone who is spiritually curious

Then courageously invite them to spend time with you and grow together in following Jesus.



## Step 2: Care For Them

### BE GENTLE LIKE A MOM

Discipleship begins with care.

Ask questions.

Listen well.

Learn about their life, struggles, joys, and spiritual journey.

People grow best when they know they are loved.

## Step 3: Meet Consistently

### BE FAITHFUL LIKE SERVANTS

Make time for regular connection throughout June and July.

This could be:

- \* Coffee
- \* Lunch
- \* A phone call
- \* A walk
- \* A family meal
- \* A Bible study

Don't overcomplicate it.

Consistency matters more than perfection.

## Step 4: Open God's Word

### BE INSTRUCTIVE LIKE A DAD

When you meet, spend some time in Scripture together.

A simple pattern:

1. Read a passage.
2. Discuss what it teaches about God.
3. Discuss how it applies to life.
4. Pray together.



You do not need to have all the answers.

Your job is simply to help someone take their next step with Jesus.

## Step 5: Walk Patiently

### BE PATIENT LIKE JESUS

Spiritual growth takes time.

Don't try to fix people.

Don't pressure people.

Don't become discouraged.

Simply walk with them, pray for them, and trust God to work.

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## What Does Success Look Like?

By August 1, you should be able to answer:

- Who did I disciple?
- How often did we meet?
- What did we learn together?
- How did I see God at work?
- What should happen next?

Success is not measured by dramatic results.

Success is measured by faithful obedience.
