The Collect of the Day

First Reading:

⁷ O Lord, you have deceived me, and I was deceived; you are stronger than I, and you have prevailed. I have become a laughingstock all the day; everyone mocks me. 8 For whenever I speak, I cry out, I shout, "Violence and destruction!" For the word of the Lord has become for me a reproach and derision all day long. 9 If I say, "I will not mention him, or speak any more in his name," there is in my heart as it were a burning fire shut up in my bones, and I am weary with holding it in, and I cannot. 10 For I hear many whispering. Terror is on every side! "Denounce him! Let us denounce him!" say all my close friends, watching for my fall. "Perhaps he will be deceived; then we can overcome him and take our revenge on him." 11 But the Lord is with me as a dread warrior; therefore my persecutors will stumble; they will not overcome me. They will be greatly shamed, for they will not succeed. Their eternal dishonor will never be forgotten. 12 O Lord of hosts, who tests the righteous, who sees the heart and the mind, let me see your vengeance upon them, for to you have I committed my cause.

¹³ Sing to the Lord; praise the Lord! For he has delivered the life of the needy from the hand of evildoers.

Psalm 69:1-18 Please read the psalm responsively by half verse

- ¹ Save me, O God!
 - For the waters have come up to my neck.
- ² I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold;

 I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me.
- ³ I am weary with my crying out; my throat is parched. *My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.*
- ⁴ More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause;

mighty are those who would destroy me, those who attack me with lies. What I did not steal must I now restore?

- ⁵ O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you.
- ⁶ Let not those who hope in you be put to shame through me, O Lord God of hosts;

let not those who seek you be brought to dishonor through me, O God of Israel.

- ⁷ For it is for your sake that I have borne reproach, *that dishonor has covered my face.*
- ⁸ I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my mother's sons.
- ⁹ For zeal for your house has consumed me, and the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me.
- ¹⁰ When I wept and humbled my soul with fasting, *it became my reproach.*
- ¹¹ When I made sackcloth my clothing, *I became a byword to them.*
- ¹² I am the talk of those who sit in the gate, and the drunkards make songs about me.

- ¹³ But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord.

 At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love answer me in your saving faithfulness.
- ¹⁴ Deliver me from sinking in the mire; let me be delivered from my enemies and from the deep waters.
- ¹⁵ Let not the flood sweep over me, or the deep swallow me up, or the pit close its mouth over me.
- ¹⁶ Answer me, O Lord, for your steadfast love is good; *according to your abundant mercy, turn to me.*
- ¹⁷ Hide not your face from your servant, for I am in distress; make haste to answer me.
- ¹⁸ Draw near to my soul, redeem me; ransom me because of my enemies!

New Testament:

Romans 6:1-11

⁶ What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ² By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷ For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸ Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ We

know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰ For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹ So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. *People: Thanks be to God.*

The Gospel: Matthew 10:16-33

¹⁶ "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves.

¹⁷ Beware of men, for they will deliver you over to courts and flog you in their synagogues, ¹⁸ and you will be dragged before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them and the Gentiles. ¹⁹ When they deliver you over, do not be anxious how you are to speak or what you are to say, for what you are to say will be given to you in that hour. ²⁰ For it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. ²¹ Brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to

death, ²² and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. ²³ When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next, for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes. ²⁴ "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant[a] above his master. ²⁵ It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household.

²⁶ "So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known.

²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. ²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. ³⁰ But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. ³¹ Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. ³² So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, ³³ but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

Sermon Dr. Chris Seitz

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
