## A little bit of history:

- Submission to the Lord as seen in <u>verses 1-7</u>
- Waiting on the Lord in verses 8-15
- Believing in the Lord, as seen in the concluding verses 16-27
- Woman who hid the spies in Jericho = <u>Rahab</u>
- The conquest of Canaan would take 20 years
- Joshua 4:6-7, what did the 12 men take up out of the dry river bed? Stones why? Shall be a memorial forever
- Commander of the army of the Lord = Jesus

#### **Submission to the Lord**

- Jericho was a <u>double walled</u> city that was about <u>8-10 acres</u> in size. It would take about <u>30-45 minutes</u> to walk around.
- Aspects that defy logic and the Law
  - o Walk around the city exposed to enemy attack
  - Never bring the Ark into the Battle, not a lucky rabbits foot
  - o Priests are not to enter into the battle
  - o Priests blew Rams horns vs. The Silver horns
  - o Don't travel or work on the Sabbath day
- It's believed that the conquest of Jericho took place on the Sabbath, and that Jesus was the one leading the attack

## Waiting on the Lord

- Israel would circle the city once for <u>6 days</u> seeing the impossibility of <u>conquering the city by force</u>. That their God would have to intercede on their behalf.
- Warren Wiersbe would put it this way, "When we <u>accept</u> God's plan, we <u>invite</u> God's presence, and that <u>guarantees</u> victory."

# **Believing in the Lord**

- The significance of the number <u>7</u> does not go unnoticed, biblically it indicates <u>perfection</u> and <u>completion</u> and that's what we witness here.
- The city was a devoted thing to the Lord or <u>Under the ban</u>, indicating that this was the <u>First-fruits</u> of this conquest, or the offering that was <u>reserved to the Lord</u>.
- With all this destruction one may think that it would be hard to find <u>Rahab</u> but, her home would be <u>the only section of wall still standing</u> with that red cord blowing in the breeze.
- The beauty of God's plan, <u>Jesus (Messiah)</u> would come from the line of this family who would be the <u>only one</u> who could redeem this family from the fate of death <u>separated from God</u>.
- How tragic that 500 years later during a wicked time in Israel this very curse would be fulfilled in <u>1Kings 16:34</u>

## What do we take away?

We don't all have the same faith journey; we don't all start at the same point, but we surely arrive at the same place the foot of the cross.
