
#### **ENCOUNTERS WITH JESUS**

You do not have to be a Christian or know anything about the Bible to enjoy these Ohana group materials.

You do not have to read, talk, sing, pray or share during the group time if you do not feel comfortable doing so. You are welcome to simply come and listen.

These materials are designed to help people examine the Bible to see what it says about Jesus -- who he is, what he is like and how he can be relevant to life today.

Within the session guides you will find links to other topics on what Jesus said about various subjects such as *Who He Is, Baptism, Holy Spirit*, etc. Some of the links will also include His practical teachings on *money, marriage, conflict resolution*, etc. Whenever you see one of the link symbols --



-- it is an opportunity for your group to decide if they want to go to that link for the next session. This way, the group can tailor-make each session to fit the needs of the group. If there is no need for digging deeper into a particular topic, then your group should move to the next *Encounter With Jesus* session.

Even if the group does not want to go to a link, you may personally choose to do so. Simply ask your Ohana leader for the guide sheet on the topic that interests you. You can go through the material on your own or with a friend or another Ohana member.

Thank you for joining us on this journey toward a deeper spiritual experience through *Encounters With Jesus*.

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# IN A BARN

#### **WELCOME**

❖ Greet each other. Get better acquainted and *hook* into the topic by sharing with each other where you were born and why you were given the name you were given, if you know.

#### WORSHIP

❖ Sing together some Christmas carols. (Even if it is in July!) Invite someone to pray.

#### WORD

- ❖ **Book** -- Read Matthew 1:18-25 and then go around the circle and ask each person to share what one verse most grabbed their attention.
- **❖** *Book* -- Read Luke 2:1-7

If someone has a map in the back of their Bible, let them share with the group where Nazareth was in connection with Bethlehem. Do you have any idea what the distance was between the two cities?

- **Form into small groups of three or four** for the next section:
- **Look** at what the **Book** (Bible passage) means:
  - Why did Joseph and Mary make this trip?
  - How do you feel about the fact that "there was no room for them in the inn"? What does this tell you about Jesus?
- **❖** *Book* --- Read Luke 2:8-20
  - Why did God announce the birth of His Son to a group of shepherds and not to the religious or community leaders?
  - How would you feel if an angel suddenly appeared before you?
  - Notice the first words the angel spoke to the shepherds. (Verse 10) What does this tell us about heaven's consideration for the feelings of human beings?
  - What "sign" did the angel give the shepherds concerning this amazing birth announcement?

- What is the significance of the words of the song that the angels sang? (verse 14)
- Summarize your thoughts about the various ways the shepherds responded to this message:

Verse 20

- How did other people respond? (verse 18)
- How did Mary respond? (verse19)
- **Took** -- Read the following verse aloud:

Who was Jesus? Go to "What Jesus said about *HIMSELF*"

Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a servant, and coming in the likeness of men. (Philippians 2:5-7)

- ❖ Share with each other what you feel is the most amazing thing about the story of the birth of Jesus.
- **Return to the larger group** for the rest of the session.

# WITNESS

- Re-read Luke 2:17 and discuss together what caused the shepherds to spread the news of Christ's birth. What could encourage you and your Ohana group to talk to people about Jesus?
- Think of the people in your community who you know and pick one or two that you think would be most likely to come to your Ohana group. Put these names on a "Blessing List" and begin praying for God to bring them to the group.
- Conclude your time together by forming a circle and inviting one or two to pray.

- Pray for your Ohana friends and the names on the Blessing List.
- Invite someone to come with you to the next Ohana meeting. You could say something like "We are meeting together in a social setting to study the Bible and find out who Jesus is, what He is like and how He can be relevant to life today."

# BY KINGS

**Advance preparation by the leader:** Get a small gift box with a lid that can be removed or decorate a box. This will be used in the **WORSHIP** time later in the evening.

#### **WELCOME**

- Fellowship together as people arrive.
- Get better acquainted and **hook** into the topic by briefly answering this question: If money were no problem for you, what gift would you buy for someone you love very much?
- ❖ After everyone has had an opportunity to share, invite someone to have a prayer.

#### WORD

- ❖ Book --- Read Matthew 2:1-23
- **Look** at what the **Book** (Bible passage) *means*:
- ❖ How many wise men were there?
- ❖ Why did they go to Jerusalem?
- ❖ Do you think the wise men saw a real star or was it a vision from God? Or something else?
- ❖ Why do you think Herod and "all Jerusalem" were troubled by the Wise Men and their question?
- ❖ Did the religious leaders know the answer to Herod's question? (vs.4-6) How did they know?
- ❖ In this passage, how many dreams are mentioned and who had them? (vs. 12, 13, 19, 22)
- Notice how many Old Testament prophecies are referred to in this passage. (vs. 5, 14, 17, 18, 23) Why do you think Matthew made so many references to Old Testament prophecies?
- ❖ Does someone in the group have a Bible with reference notes that tell where the original prophecy was located? If so, you may wish to read the Old Testament

prophecies for these verses. (For example, Matthew 2:5 is a quote from Micah 5:2)

Note: There are over 300 references in the Old Testament of Christ's coming; all of which were written at least 400 years before He appeared! For a list of some of these prophecies, see the *Extra Reading Material* at the end of this session.

❖ *Took* -- Discuss together what gifts people today can give to Jesus.

# WORSHIP

- ❖ Give each person a few small pieces of paper and ask each one to write down a gift they would like to give Jesus. Use one piece of paper for each idea. People could also write down a praise or love note to Jesus. It is not necessary for people to sign their names. Gather up the papers and put them in the gift box. Then pass the gift box around and let each person read one or two of the notes inside until all have been read.
- ❖ Sing together some praise songs, concluding with "I Love You, Lord."
- ❖ The Ohana leader will pray a short prayer of praise and give time for anyone else to do so, too.

# **WITNESS**

- Review the Blessing List which your group has started. Add any new names the group may have. Notice if any prayers have been answered.
- ❖ Encourage Ohana members to choose prayer partners of the same gender within the group and make contact with each other during the week.

- Pray for your Ohana friends and the names on the Blessing List.
- Contact your prayer partner.
- Continue to pray and look for people to invite to the next Ohana meeting.

# **Form into smaller groups of three or four** to do the next section:

- **❖ Look** at what the **Book** (Bible passage) *means*: Do you see any significance in the way Jesus developed? (vs. 40, 51, 52)
- ❖ What do you think you would have liked about Jesus as a child or young person?
- Notice that Jesus' parents and Jesus Himself followed the laws given to Israel by God. Re-read verses 23, 24, 39, 42.
- ❖ Compare these verses with what Jesus said in Matthew 5:17.

What Jesus said about *LAW* 

- **❖** *Took*\_ -- Do you think God expects Christians today to "fulfill" His Law? How is it possible to do this?
- ❖ The Bible says "Love is the fulfillment of the law." (Romans 13:10, last part)
- ❖ Jesus said: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:37-40)
- ❖ Love is the only way to fulfill the law! This means that if we have trouble obeying God's laws, we really have a love problem. Unless we have a "full tank" of love for God, we will always find it hard to do what God asks.
- ❖ Take a quick, personal look at your "love-for-God gauge." (You need not share this with anyone.) Pencil in where you are, spiritually, at this time:

Full
Three-quarters full
Half-full
One-fourth full
Empty

❖ Discuss together: What does it take to be filled with God's love? **Return to the larger group.** 

# **WITNESS**

- Review the Blessing List, getting an update on any prayer answers and adding any new names the group may have.
- ❖ Invite each person in the group to think of three people they know who live in the community whom they would like to see become a part of the Ohana group.
- ❖ Encourage each other to pray a "prayer of three" for these three people. Think of ways to show God's love to them in a tactful, yet tangible way.

- Pray for your Ohana friends.
- Pray the "prayer of three."
- Consider inviting one of these three persons to come with you to the next Ohana meeting.
- Contact your prayer partner.

# **WELCOME**

- ❖ Greet each other and introduce any guests or first-time visitors.
- ❖ Get better acquainted and *hook* into the session topic by briefly completing the sentence, "The first time I realized there was a God who cares for me was . . . "

# WORSHIP

- ❖ Sing together two or three of your group's favorite praise songs about Jesus. Suggestions: "Praise the Name of Jesus," "King of Kings" "Majesty" "Lord, I Lift Your Name on High," "He Is Lord," "Jesus, Name Above All Names" (All of these are in the Maranatha! Music Praise Book #3; pp. 200,137,212,199,126,47)
- ❖ Invite one or two who feel comfortable praying in a group, to have prayer.







- ❖ Invite one or two who feel comfortable praying in a group, to have prayer.
- **Form into smaller groups of three or four.**

- Conclude your time together by going around the circle and each person praying a brief prayer for the person on his/her right.

# AT THE FISHING BOATS

#### WELCOME

- ❖ Greet each other and share what's been happening in your lives since the last meeting.
- ❖ Get better acquainted and *hook* into the session topic by sharing briefly some time when a "chance" encounter totally changed your life.

#### WORSHIP

- Sing together two or three of your group's favorite praise songs about Jesus.) Suggestions: "Praise the Name of Jesus," "King of Kings" "Majesty" "Lord, I Lift Your Name on High," "He Is Lord," "Jesus, Name Above All Names" (All of these are in the Maranatha! Music Praise Book #3; pp. 200, 137, 212, 199, 126, 47)

  Introduce a new song to the group. (Suggestion: "Emmanuel" p. 36)
- ❖ Invite one or two who feel comfortable praying in a group, to have prayer.
- **Form into smaller groups of three or four** to do the next sections:

- ❖ Conclude your time together by having prayer partners get together and pray for each other's "Three" as well as any other needs or praises that may be expressed to each other.

# **AT NIGHT**

# **WELCOME**

- ❖ Greet each other and debrief on how each person's week has been.
- ❖ Get better acquainted and hook into the session topic by briefly answering the question: What important or famous person would you most like to meet?

#### WORSHIP

- ❖ Sing together two or three of your group's favorite praise songs.
- ❖ Invite one or two who feel comfortable praying in a group, to have prayer.
- **\*** Form into smaller groups of three or four.

# WORD

**Book** – Read a passage from the Bible to see what it <u>says</u>.


- Read John 3:1-18 in a modern version of the Bible and answer as quickly as you can the following questions to make sure you know what these verses are *saving*.
  - What position did Nicodemus hold? (vs. 1)
  - What time of day did he meet Jesus? (vs. 2)
  - How did Nicodemus begin the conversation? (vs. 2)

  - Nicodemus replied by asking "how can a man be b\_\_\_\_\_ when he is old? (vs. 4)
  - Jesus said people must be born of w\_\_\_\_\_ and
     S\_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 5)
  - Jesus compared the Spirit to the w\_\_\_\_\_. (vs. 8)

Note: In verse 14, Jesus referred to a snake being lifted up by Moses in the desert. This Old Testament incident (Numbers 21:4-9) concerned a plague of poisonous snakes that attacked Israel in the desert as they traveled from Egypt to the Promised Land. Many people died. God instructed Moses to make a bronze snake and put it on a pole. Anyone who was bitten by a snake could look at the snake that had been lifted up and they would be healed. Jesus is saying in this verse that when He is "lifted up" on the cross, anyone who looks to him by believing in Him, can be healed of sin's deadly bite.

**Look** at what the Bible passage *means*:

- Why did Nicodemus meet Jesus at night? (vs.2)
- What do you think of Jesus' opening remarks to Nicodemus? (vs.3)
- What does it mean to be "born again" of "water and the Spirit"? (vs.3,5-7,16-18)



- What do verses 16 and 17 tell us about God?
- What do verses 16 and 17 tell us about Jesus? (Designate one person in your group to report your group's answer to this question)

Right now, there are some people here who want to be born again.

This is their prayer:

"Dear God, I believe in Jesus. I am sorry for my sins and I want to be forgiven.

I ask Jesus to come into my heart. I want to be born again
and start a brand, new life in Him. Thank you for saving me! Amen."

The "Be Attitudes" of giving a personal testimony:

- **Be brief** -1 to 3 minutes
- Be confident and positive.
- Be enthusiastic, happy and friendly.
- Be specific.
- Be real, authentic, sincere.

Use the following format to write out your brief personal testimony: (Use extra paper if you need to, to edit and refine your testimony)

<b>Part 1 – BEFORE</b> (Briefly describe your life before becoming a Christian. Example: "I used to feel " or "I used to think " etc.)
<b>Part II – HOW</b> (Briefly describe how people, places or events contributed to you becoming a Christian. Beware of using "Christian jargon," words such as "saved,"
"redeemed," "born again," etc., which are unknown to your non-Christian friend)
Part III – SINCE (Briefly describe your life since becoming a Christian. Examples:
"Since I 've made this change in my life, I am now able to" or "Since I've become a Christian these positive changes took place in my life" These items could be the reverse of Part I.)

  - What did Jesus say was the meaning of the bread and the cup? (Luke 22:19,20)
  - Jesus replaced the Passover service (killing and eating a lamb) with The Lord's Supper (eating bread, drinking the juice of the grape vine). Why do you think He did this?
- **❖** *Book* Read Luke 21:24-27 and John 13:1-17
- **Look** at what the passage *means* by discussing the following questions:

- How would you describe the spiritual condition of the disciples at this time? (Luke 21:24)
- Do you think the disciples "got" what Jesus said to them in Luke 22:25-27?
- How did Jesus demonstrate His teaching? (John 13:5)
- Why do you believe Peter reacted the way He did when Jesus approached him? (John 13:6-8)
- What reversed Peter's attitude? (John 13:8,9)
- What did Jesus mean in verse 10?
- How clear did Jesus make this lesson? (verses 12-16)
- **Return to the larger group** and discuss the following question together:
- **❖** What does the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples tell us about Jesus?
- ★ Took Jesus said His action of washing the disciples' feet was an e\_\_\_\_\_. (verse 15) How can we follow this example?
  - The early Christian church celebrated the Lord's Supper. Eventually, this service was named "Communion" and most Christian churches have "communion" on a regular basis. But not many churches include foot-washing as part of this memorial service of what Jesus did for us. The Seventh-day Adventist church always conducts foot-washing among believers prior to the communion service. Do you think this is a good idea? Does it have a biblical basis? What does it symbolize?
