Maundy Thursday Service of Divine Worship March 28, 2024 – 7:00 p.m.

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Tonight we enjoy the blessings of the Lord's Supper, remembering the texts of Scripture that record our Savior's institution of this New Covenant meal. Monumental events had preceded these moments in the Upper Room and will also occur subsequent to the disciples as they leave to go to the Garden of Gethsemane.

The Passover is observed by Christ in obedience to God's Word. The Old Covenant meal of renewal which remembers the deliverance of God's people from the bondage of slavery in Egypt through Moses by the power of God... And which also points to the deliverance of God's people from the bondage of sin through Jesus Christ to the glory of God.

In the midst of turmoil, internal disputes among the disciples and the full knowledge of the task that awaited Him, our Savior washes the feet of the disciples, equips them with the truth of His Word, anoints them with the Holy Spirit, and sends them forward. Come and sit with this same patient, gracious, and glorious Savior and with each other tonight at His Table.

Westminster Catechism, Questions 96 and 97

Leader: What is the Lord's Supper?

All:

The Lord's Supper is a sacrament, wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to Christ's appointment, His death is showed forth; and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of His body and blood, with all His benefits, to their spiritual nourishment, and growth in grace.

Leader: What is required for the worthy receiving of the Lord's Supper?

All:

It is required of them that would worthily partake of the Lord's Supper, that they examine themselves of their knowledge to discern the Lord's body, of their faith to feed upon Him, of their repentance, love, and new obedience; lest, coming unworthily, they eat and drink judgment to themselves.

The Corporate Confession of Sin

All:

Have mercy on us, O God, according to Your steadfast love; according to Your abundant mercy blot out our transgressions. Wash us thoroughly from our iniquity, and cleanse us from our sin! For we know our transgressions, and our sin is ever before us. Against You, You only, have we sinned and done what is evil in Your sight, so that You may be justified in Your words and blameless in Your judgment. Create in us a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within us. Cast us not away from Your presence, and take not Your Holy Spirit from us. Restore to us the joy of Your salvation, and uphold us with a willing spirit.
