“Say So!”

Psalm 107

We must give thanks for God’s steadfast love! (107:1–3)

1. That finds us in our lostness. (107: 4–9)
2. That shines upon us in darkness. (107:10–16)
3. That condescends to us in our foolishness. (107:17–22)
4. That secures us in the midst of evil. (107:23–32)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. Wisdom, according to this psalm, isn't abstract, but is the ability to see God's steadfast love in our lives and respond both in praise and in testimony—by “saying so.” Which of the four scenes of Psalm 107 is most true of your life? Is there a specific person God may be calling you to share with this week about his steadfast love?
2. Where and when has God led you out of your own "desert waste" — a season of aimlessness, exhaustion, or spiritual hunger where you had no sense of direction or home?
3. The Psalmist calls the fools' condition exactly what it is — self-inflicted, the result of sin. Is there an area of your life where you've been tempted to excuse or rename your own foolish sin rather than acknowledge what God plainly calls it?
4. Given that Christ himself endured the “darkness and bonds” of God’s judgement that we deserved, what keeps you from speaking plainly to someone you know who is still bound by guilt they don't know how to escape?
