Barbara grew up in Birmingham and attended Lakeview Elementary and Shades Valley High School. At the age of 12, she began pursuing her dream of a career as a professional ballerina with an opportunity to train at Ballet Arts in New York City.

Later, she studied theatre at Northwestern University while dancing with a company in Chicago.

Life presented her with exciting opportunities in the world of the arts, but she gladly exchanged those dreams for the thought of marrying a wild navy pilot (and childhood crush) named Frank Barker.

Little did she know that he would become a preacher, and in 1961 she would become a preacher's wife!

God brought them each to a knowledge of salvation by grace and knit their lives together in such a way that for 60 years they would serve the Lord as a team.

In 1980 Briarwood Church invited Barbara to start a ballet ministry. Armed with the conviction that the arts could be used for God's glory, Barbara began Briarwood Ballet with 45 students.

Since then, thousands of students have been trained for the glory of God.

She also formed two companies, *Ballet Exaltation* and *Immanuel*, which perform internationally as the missions' arms of the ballet school.

Barbara wrote both poetry and hundreds of Bible studies and she spoke nationally and internationally. Nothing, however, brought her more joy than serving the Lord with Frank and opening her home to share Jesus Christ.
