## Hebrews 10:1-18 "Jesus is a Better Sacrifice" Pastor Bruce Zachary

Intro. Imagine living under the sacrificial system of the Mosaic Law. How do you think you might feel? [\* Seth: God should kill a man instead of innocent animals]

Subject: Jesus' perfect sacrifice Object: Receive and rejoice in Christ's perfect sacrifice

A. The problem of animal sacrifice [1-4]

1. Inadequate to make you perfect (right with God) [1] For the law, having a <u>shadow of</u> <u>the good things to come</u>, *and* not the very image of the things, <u>can never</u> with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, <u>make those who approach</u> <u>perfect</u>.

a. Sacrifices per Mosaic Law was a shadow that reveals the Messiah's sacrifice

i. \*\* The shadow is not the thing but reveals the thing

2. Inadequacy is revealed by the need to repeat yearly [2-3] For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. <sup>3</sup> But in those *sacrifices there is* a reminder of sins every year: If the sacrifice was adequate there would be no need to repeat

i. \*\* If you need to keep taking a prescription then you're not cured

ii. Every year when you make a sacrifice there is a reminder of sin and guilt

3. Inadequate to take away sins [4] For *it is* <u>not possible</u> that the blood of bulls and goats could <u>take away sins</u>: animal sacrifice merely provide a covering (Kippur – covering), <u>but don't take away sin</u>

\*\* Pet stains in your carpet: there is a difference between covering and taking away: Trying to cover-up, but occasional reminder of stain and odor, and need to be clean

B. The purpose of Christ's sacrifice [5-10]

1. God Himself became the perfect sacrifice [5-7] Therefore, when He came into the world, He said: "Sacrifice and offering You did not desire, <u>But a body You have</u> <u>prepared for Me.<sup>6</sup> In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin You had no pleasure. <sup>7</sup> Then I said, 'Behold, I have come — In the volume of the book it is written of Me — To do Your will, O God. [Ps. 40:6-8 Septuagint translation]</u>

a. Inadequate animal sacrifice was never the perfect will of God - foretold

b. a body [5], Behold, I have come [6] the incarnation

c. Gen. 22, Jn.1:29

2. God's perfect will to set-apart man to God by Messiah [8-10] Previously saying, "Sacrifice and offering, burnt offerings, and *offerings* for sin You did not desire, nor had pleasure *in them*" (which are offered according to the law),<sup>9</sup> then He said, "<u>Behold, I have come to do Your will, O God</u>." He takes away the first that He may establish the second.

## a. God has set-apart believers to Himself through Christ's sacrifice [10] <u>By that will we</u> have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

i. Once for all: sufficient for all, but only effective for believers, no need to offer again
ii. Lu. 22:39-44 Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane: Not my will but yours be done ...
iii. Rev. 13:8 Jesus is the Lamb slain before the foundation of the world
Why should believers rejoice in Christ's sacrifice?

## C. The perfection of Christ's sacrifice [11-18]

1. Jesus' sacrifice finished the work [11-13] And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. <sup>12</sup> But this Man, after He had offered <u>one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God</u>, <sup>13</sup> from that time waiting till His enemies are made His footstool.

a. Priests stand & repeatedly sacrifice daily that cover but don't take away sin [11]

b. Cf. Jesus seated [12, 8:1]. Work is finished one sacrifice for sins forever

2. Jesus' sacrifice is perfect and perfects believers forever [14] For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified:

a. Jesus' sacrifice gives believers perfect *standing* before God by taking our penalty b. Jesus' sacrifice gives believers perfect *peace* knowing we are set-apart to God

\*\* **Cf. Days of Awe** between Rosh Hashanah + Yom Kippur: repentance & tradition re hope to be sealed in book of life for coming year

3. Jesus' sacrifice provides forgiveness, and begins the new covenant [15-17] But the Holy Spirit also witnesses to us; for after He had said before, <sup>16</sup> "This *is* the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the LORD: I will put My laws into their hearts, and in their minds I will write them <sup>17</sup> then He adds, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." [Jer. 31-34]

a. No other sacrifice for sin is acceptable [18] Now where there is remission of these, *there is* no longer an offering for sin.

i. New Covenant foretold **Jer.31:31-34**. Promise of a transformed heart and mind and complete forgiveness of sin
