I. What is the Church?

"And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18)

- A. a church is much more than a building
- B. the Church is the people of God

"Now you are the body of Christ, and members individually." (1 Corinthians 12:27)

Discussion Question: How does understanding we are the church change the way we worship the Lord?

- II. How did the Church begin?
- A. the Church officially began in Jerusalem at Pentecost (Acts 2)
- III. What are the purposes of the Church?
- "But you shall receive the power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8).
- A. the first purpose of the Church is to proclaim the gospel to the world
- B. a second purpose of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:18-20)
- Discussion Question: How can individual believers help fulfill the Church's responsibility to make disciples?
- IV. What are the roles in the Church?

- A. God has designated specific roles within the Body of Christ (Ephesians 4:11, 1 Timothy 3:1-13, and Titus 1:5-9)
- 1. apostle ("one who is sent out")
- a. a special messenger of Jesus Christ, to whom He delegated authority for certain tasks
- 2. prophet
- a. one who spoke for God and communicated His message to His people
- 3. elder (bishop; overseer) (1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-9)
- a. responsible for spiritual oversight of the people of God
- 4. pastor/teacher (Ephesians 4:11)
- a. responsible for shepherding the people of God and teaching them His Word
- 5. deacon (1 Timothy 3)
- a. someone who commits to serve in a particular area of ministry
- 6. each believer is a critical part of the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12-27)
- V. What special activities should the Church be doing?
- A. baptism
- 1. a public demonstration of a personal, inward decision to believe in Jesus Christ
- B. communion (the Lord's Supper)
- 1. an opportunity for believers to remember who Jesus is and what He's done for us
