ONE ANOTHER

Big Idea: Because God has made His children one in Christ, believers must love one another deeply and honor one another humbly.

LOVE ONE ANOTHER DEEPLY (Romans 12:10a)

Key Thought: Gospel transformation produces genuine, supernatural love among believers.

- What is the difference between merely attending church and genuinely loving fellow believers like family, and how does Jesus say love validates discipleship? (e.g. John 13:34-35; 1 Thessalonians 4:9; 1 John 2:9-11)
- Why is unconditional, committed love sometimes difficult within the church, and how should the Gospel shape our response when relationships become messy or hard? (e.g. Colossians 3:12-14; Ephesians 4:1-3, 32)
- What practical step can you take this week to move from surface-level church relationships toward biblical community and genuine brotherly affection? (e.g. Acts 2:42-47)

HONOR ONE ANOTHER HUMBLY (Romans 12:10b)

Key Thought: Gospel humility elevates others over self.

- Why is honoring others difficult in a culture focused on recognition and self-promotion, and what does biblical humility look like according to Scripture? (e.g. John 13:14-17; Philippians 2:3-8; Proverbs 27:2)
- Who has God placed in your life or church family that may need encouragement, appreciation, or honor right now, and how can you intentionally build them up this week? (e.g. 1 Thessalonians 5:14-15; Hebrews 3:13)
- How does Jesus redefine greatness, and what would change in our homes, church, and relationships if we competed to honor others instead of ourselves? (e.g. Matthew 5:3-12; Mark 10:42-45)
