ROMANS 8:9-13

DEAD, BUT ALIVE

Big Idea: If the Spirit of God truly dwells in us, He not only establishes our identity and gives us new life, but also empowers our ongoing war against sin.

THE SPIRIT ESTABLISHES IDENTITY (Read Romans 8:9)

- What does Paul identify as the non-negotiable marker of true Christianity in v. 9?
- How does the Spirit's indwelling presence give assurance of salvation? (e.g. Romans 8:16)
- How would your confidence in Christ change if you embraced that your identity is established by the Spirit rather than your success or failure?

THE SPIRIT IMPARTS LIFE (Read Romans 8:10-11)

- What is Paul contrasting in v. 10 and why is that important to understand?
- Give careful attention to v. 11. What does resurrection life look like now, and what does it mean for the believer at death?
- How does understanding that the Spirit of God lives in you affect the way you look at sin, obedience, spiritual fruit, struggle, etc.?

THE SPIRIT EMPOWERS VICTORY (Read Romans 8:12-13)

- Why does Paul insist we are not obligated or in debt to the flesh, but what does it mean that if a person lives according to the flesh, they will die?
- What does it practically mean to "put to death" the deeds of the body rather than merely manage, excuse, or hide them?
- While the Christian has eternal victory settled because of the finished work of Jesus, how does a Christian fight sin in the power of the Holy Spirit while they remain on the earth?
