### DEUTERONOMY 15

1. In Deut. 15, what were the people to do every 7 years? Release the debtor of their debts
2. When it came to lending, should you show favoritism? No
3. Every 7<sup>th</sup> year they were required to do something that didn't make sense, what was the 2-word factor? To forgive the debts and it relied upon the "God Factor"
4. What were they to remember regarding the release of their servants? They had been servants in Egypt.
5. What did they do to a servant if they wanted to stay? A hole in the ear to show ownership
6. A common phrase used 4-5 times, what were they ultimately to be trusting in? "For the Lord shall greatly bless thee" – to trust in the Lord to bless.
7. What was to happen to the firstborn of all the animals? Sanctified/set apart for the Lord

### DEUTERONOMY 16

8. What is the first feast of this section? Passover
9. What did that feast symbolize for us? Our redemption through Christ
10. What was the second feast? Feast of weeks or Pentecost.
11. What did the second feast symbolize? The enablement and enlistment of the Holy Spirit and a time of renewal.
12. What was the third feast? Feast of Tabernacles
13. What did the third feast symbolize? We are pilgrims with a heavenly home
14. What did God say to provide in all the city gates? Judges and officers

### DEUTERONOMY 17

15. Regarding the sacrifice that they made to God, what shouldn't it have? Should not be blemished or lame
16. What was the Jewish form of capital punishment? Stoning
17. What was the minimum number of witnesses required to put someone to death? 2
18. What did the witnesses have to do to participate in the trial? Put their hands upon them or participate in the capital punishment
19. If a judge couldn't make a decision, what was the next step? High priest/Levites
20. Who would ask for a king? People
21. How would they go about choosing a king? God appointed
22. Did the king have to be an Israelite? Only Israelites
23. What 3 things were they not to multiply? Horses, wives, gold/silver
24. What were they to write and read all the days of their life? Copy of the law

### DEUTERONOMY 18

25. What did the priests and Levites rely upon to survive? Offerings of the people of Israel
26. What was the heathen practice among the Canaanites that the Israelites were NOT to do? Sorcery/witchcraft
27. What did it say God would raise up from among their brethren and who did this ultimately refer to? A Prophet, Jesus Christ
28. What was the litmus test to determine if a prophet were truly called by God and spoke God's Words? The prophecy they spoke would have to come to pass.

30. How many of these places were there and where were they located with regard to the Promised land? 6, 3 inside and 3 outside of the Promised Land

32. Give 2 analogies from these places to Jesus and us. Jesus is our refuge and anyone can go in
33. What is the minimum number of witnesses before a person could be found guilty? 2
34. What are the 2 key words that effect the type of punishment? Hear and fear
35. The OT is symbolic of the law and what person? The NT is symbolic of grace and what person? OT Moses, NT Jesus
36. In 19:21, there is a key phrase that represented the law that is still heard today? Eye for eye, tooth for tooth

## **DEUTERONOMY 20**

37. In Ch. 20, what promise did Israel's military have going into battle? "God is with us"
