3. Theme: Obedience = Blessings, Disobedience = Burdens

5. What way did God describe the land? "It flowed with milk and honey."
6. In 11:12, a key verse that said the land was different from the rest of the all the lands; what was different? It was a land which the Lord thy God cared for
7. In their agricultural society, what were the 2 types of rains? Early and latter rain
8. In 11:24-25, what did Moses tell all the people that he usually just told the leader? The promise that 'every place that you walk will be yours.'
9. In 11:26-32, what 2 paths/ways did God set before the people? Path of blessing and cursing

10. How many places of worship would God establish in the land? one
11. How many places of worship did the Canaanites have? Many/1000s
12. What part of the animal were they not supposed to eat/drink? blood
13. In Deut. 12:31, the Canaanites had done something that God hated. What was it? The sacrifice of their children

14. In Deut. 13:11, There were 2 words used to help keep the people from going astray. What punishment came from God upon others who sinned? "Hear" and "fear"

17. What was supposed to happen every third year with the offering? Given to Lord to provide for Levites, strangers, fatherless and widows

24. A common phrase used 4-5 times, what were they ultimately to be trusting in? "For the Lord shall greatly bless thee" – to trust in the Lord to bless.
25. What was to happen to the firstborn of all the animals? Sanctified/set apart for the Lord

26. What is the first feast of this section? Passover
27. What did that feast symbolize for us? Our redemption through Christ
28. What was the second feast? Feast of weeks or Pentecost.
29. What did the second feast symbolize? The enablement and enlistment of the Holy Spirit and a time of renewal.
30. What was the third feast? Feast of Tabernacles
31. What did the third feast symbolize? We are pilgrims with a heavenly home
32. What did God say to provide in all the city gates? Judges and officers
