I. There is One True God

1. What does Isaiah 45:5-6 teach us about what God thinks of other gods? God declares "I am God and there is none else beside me."
2. Who is the source of our knowledge of God? God Himself
3. What two facts does the Bible attest to and what do they mean?
 1. Incomprehensibility - mind cannot grasp the knowledge of Him. Also this means that man cannot know everything about Him.
 2. Knowability - He can be known. This does not mean that we can know everything about him.
4. Through what means has God chosen to reveal Himself to us? Primarily His Word
5. What should this then cause us to do? Revere and worship Him

II. God is Infinite

1. Knowing that God is eternal and exists endlessly, this means we can have confidence that God has never, nor will He ever; cease to exist
2. What are three of the attributes of God along with what they mean?
 1. Omni scient - God knows everything things actual and possible, effortlessly and equally well
 2. Omni present - God is everywhere present with His whole being at all times
 3. Omni potent - all powerful and able to do anything consistent with His own nature

III. God is the Creator

1. What does Colossians 1:15-16 teach us about God? He created everything visible and invisible. Everything was created by Him and for Him.
2. If someone were to ask you what the purpose of life is, what would you tell them and what verses could you use to support what you tell them? The purpose of life is to bring honor and glory to God. Rev. 4:11; Col. 1:15-16; Ps. 90:2; Gen. 1

IV. God is Holy

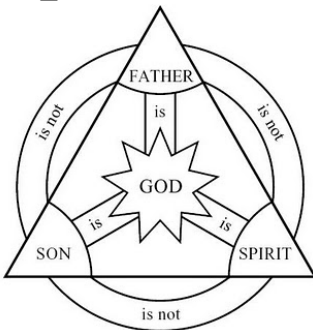
1. Holiness means not only that He is separate from all that is unclean and evil but also that He is positively pure and thus distinct from all others.
2. What does 1 Peter 1:15-16 teach us about God's standard for us? He wants us to be holy as He is holy
3. What do many Christians use as their standard? Other imperfect people
4. How do we stack up against Jesus Christ as our standard? Jesus is perfect, we are all born in sin and we fall short of His glory (Rom. 3:23).
