- 57. Jesus for a second time in as many chapters tells the disciples something that was coming? Matt. 17:22-23. <u>His forthcoming passion, crucifixion, death and resurrection.</u>

- 64. The rich young ruler who had kept so many of the commandments went away from following Jesus because of what? He had riches he was unwilling to part with to follow Jesus and essentially showing he had indeed violated the commandments because of his love of money.
- 65. In context, what does Matthew 19:26 "...with men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible." specifically mean? It is set against the lesson of the rich young ruler who sought to save himself by his good works. Thus it is impossible to do so... and yet with God all things "Salvation foremost" is possible.
- 66. Matthew 19:28-30, Explain what Matthew 19:30 means "But many that are first shall be last; and the last shall be first.": It means that those who seek to live and gain this world will be last in eternity, and those who live for the gain of eternity will be the last in this life.

- 67. What was the lesson from the Workers in the Vineyard parable? <u>The last shall be first and the first last. It warns us against jealousy and impurity of motive in serving Christ.</u>

- 75. What ultimately led to the excuses given for not accepting the Wedding Invitation and who were brought in as a result? <u>The religious leaders—"made light of" the invitation and as a result those out in highways and hedges both bad and good were brought in.</u>
- 76. What did Jesus teach in Matthew 22:15-22 regarding paying of taxes? Pay to Caesar (government) what's due and to God what's due.
- 77. Matthew 22:23-33 Is there marriage in heaven? No Will we know each other? Yes
