### Deuteronomy 26

1. From Ch. 26, what was the offering that the Israelites were to bring upon entering the Promised Land? The first fruits of the land
2. What application can we take from that offering for us today? To give God our first and best part
3. In 26:18, what did God proclaim the people would be? A peculiar and holy people unto the LORD.

### Deuteronomy 27

4. What was the name of the mount that they were to set up a memorial? Mt. Ebal
5. What were they to write on the memorial? The Law
6. What was significant about how the altar was to be crafted? From uncut stones and be covered with a plaster that would have the law written upon it.
7. What was the name of the Mount of Blessing? Mt. Gerizim.
8. Name the 6 tribes that blessed the people. Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Joseph, Benjamin
9. Name the 6 tribes that cursed the people. Reuben, Gad, Asher, Dan, Naphtali, Zebulun
10. Name the 6 tribes that cursed the people in advance for disobedience to the Law. Reuben, Gad, Asher, Dan, Naphtali, Zebulun
11. Why did God command that they write this on the memorial? To establish order and authority to a new generation

17. Give 5 things that would happen if they were disobedient from 28:15-68. Pestilence, scattered, borrow and not lend, eat their children, be oppressed, beaten in battle, etc
18. Of the curses for disobedience, which one seemed especially unnatural? Eating their children
19. In 28:67 they desired a different time, what did they desire and why? In the morning they desired evening, in the evening they desired morning because of fear
