4. What caused Jesus to marvel in Mark 6:6 and what were 2 byproducts thereof? The unbelief of those in Nazareth and as a result Jesus' mighty works were limited and furthermore He went and ministered to other villages where they would believe.
5. What attribute of God does Jesus display in Mark 5:32 "And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing."? Omniscience. All knowing.
6. A prophet doesn't have honor where? In his own country Why? Community knows him, his background, his family. He is common and familiar to them.
7. Why would it be more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrah than it would for the cities that Jesus' disciples preached to? Sodom & Gomorrah didn't have Jesus, His message and miracles so clear. These cities did.
8. Why was John the Baptist was beheaded? He preached against Herod and Herodias's sin
9. T/F: Jesus feeds the 5,000 with five loaves and two fish.
10. What type of heart did Jesus have towards the people according to Mark 6:34? Shepherd's heart towards lost sheep – one of compassion.

12. Why did Jesus ultimately rebuke the Pharisees as summarized in Mark 7:6-13? List 3 things Jesus rebuked them for in Mark 7:6-13: 1. They drew nigh with their lips but their heart was far from Him. 2. They taught their tradition superseded the Commandments of God and living out its principles. 3. They essentially made the Word of God of no effect through your traditions.
13. Mark 7:37 "...He hath done all things well."

15. In the feeding of the 4,000 we see a principle about how they followed Jesus for 3 days without having any food. What principle did we make from this? To follow Christ, it should cost you something. No sacrifice – no discipleship – no reward

18. In Mark 9, why couldn't the disciples cast out the demons... In other words, this kind of miracle came only by prayer_____ and fasting_____.
19. Who is the greatest in Mark 9:33-41? Least of all - servants_____

1. In Mark 6:16 something seemed to trouble King Herod upon hearing of the ministry of Jesus Christ. What was it? He seemed to have a guilty conscience and feared and was troubled by the prospect that John the Baptist had risen from the dead.

Mark 9:43 "Into the fire that never shall be quenched." 9:44, 46, 48 "Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched."
