REVIEW IT

Do you need to hear from God? Does God need to hear from you? For example, do you want to hear words of forgiveness, or peace, or love, or hope? God didn't send Jesus to us as a concept or as an angel – Jesus came to us in flesh as a human, as one of us. Jesus came to give all of us the life God always wanted his people to have. The prophecy about Jesus in Isaiah 7:14 said that he "shall be called Immanuel," which means "God is with us." At the time Jesus was born, Israel was in the midst of suffering oppression, despair, and silence from God. Through Jesus, God became one of his people. The name "Jesus" is the most important word of all! Jesus saves us by giving us a fresh start with God, room to breathe, sufficiency in place of scarcity, and freedom from distress. Let Jesus' name ring out!

Spend some time in the word... Read Hebrews 2:5-18

TALK ABOUT IT

- Can you think of a story from the Old Testament when God helped someone out of oppression, scarcity, despair, or feelings of abandonment.
- Jesus provides a fresh start with God when we accept him as our savior. Our sins are forgiven and forgotten. Can you think of a New Testament story of Jesus providing a new start for someone?
- "Jesus turns my scarcity into sufficiency." What is an example of physical, emotional, or spiritual resources being depleted and how can God turn that scarcity into strength and sufficiency?

ACT ON IT

What What outcomes have you or someone you know experienced after calling on the name of Jesus? As you go to prayer, speak Jesus' name over the circumstances and people in your life.

PRAY ABOUT IT

Take some time to ask how you can pray for and support one another this week. Then, close praying for one another.

Pray: Father in heaven, we thank you for sending Jesus, our Savior, to dwell among us and save us from sin. Jesus, you came that we may have life in all its fullness, to provide rest for the weary, and turn our scarcity into sufficiency. We ask you to help us let go of our brokenness and hold onto your strength. Holy Spirit, teach us to call on the name of Jesus in all circumstances. Remind us to summon his name, calling him into our presence, and to send his name into whatever situation we face.
