REVIEW IT

Is the pattern for our life pre-determined or is it possible for us to miss God's plan? The Bible teaches that the choice is ours. Many people miss God-opportunities because they do not understanding that God's plan must be chosen. We make our choices, and then our choices make us. Moses made four choices that shaped his life.
