♦ BY FAITH YOU SACRIFICE

By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had embraced the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son, even though God had said to him, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned." Abraham reasoned that God could even raise the dead, and so in a manner of speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death.

Hebrews 11:17-19 (NIV)

God sent Christ to be our sacrifice. Christ offered his life's blood, so by faith in him we could come to God. Romans 3:25 (CEV)

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♦ BY FAITH YOU STEP OUT

REVIEW IT

The life of Abraham shows us how to have a faith and perspective that cooperates with God, even when God may challenge or even change our faith direction.

Following Abraham's example: **By faith you step ou**t against your fears and step into the vision God has for your life. When facing the unknowns, look at the *first step*, not the whole journey. Look to God, instead of yourself, for God's knowledge more than makes up for what you don't know. **By faith you stay** the course, even in the face of obstacles. Problems are a part of life, but it is better to choose the problems of a Christ-centered life backed by Christ's strength instead of the problems that accompany a self-centered life on your own strength. **By faith you succeed** as you trust God's promises despite doubt, difficulties, or disappointments. **By faith you sacrifice**, understanding that the work of blessing others for God's glory is ongoing — yet, the rewards will last forever.

Spend some time in the Word: Read Genesis chapter 15

TALK ABOUT IT

- 1. Fears can often be paralyzing, keeping us from moving forward on the path God has for us. What is God calling you to do, but you may be letting fear keeping you from obeying? How can taking the first step put you in motion?
- 2. God not only wants us to *get to* the promised land, He wants us to *live in* the promised land. What does that mean for you? What steps can you take to build your present on the foundations of the future?
- 3. There is no faith without struggles. In spite of this, do you find yourself settling for less, working out of your own strength, or trusting in God to see you through? Share a time in your life where God helped you see the best strategy.

ACT ON IT/PRAY ABOUT IT

Sometimes we achieve success in an area of our life, and then think we can set that area on the shelf and coast the rest of the way. God doesn't want us to waste the work we have put into it. The book of Hebrews shares the examples of faith filled followers. Who can you share *your* life examples and experiences with to further God's Kingdom? Remember, you only need to be one step ahead to lead those behind to be a disciple maker.

Pray for God to open your eyes to someone to lead, and the courage to step out in faith.
