REVIEW IT

The Christmas story is a story of waiting—the world was waiting for a Savior, and God answered that need by sending his Son to earth at **just the right time** in history. Jesus' birth tells us many things about God, the master of timing.

- 1) God doesn't tell us the timing details in advance All of the details would overwhelm us, and God wants us to trust Him one day at a time.
- 2) God sees time differently than we do God has always been eternal and is not limited by time.
- 3) God's timing is rarely convenient for us God's has a bigger and better plan, and it doesn't always align with what we are wanting or expecting.
- 4) God can do anything at anytime God's timing develops our character as we wait on Him.

In the coming weeks of this series, we will study what God wants us to do while we wait: Fret not, Fear not, Forget not, and Faint not. But regardless of God's timing, it is **always** the right time to come back to God and to receive the saving grace of Jesus Christ.
