THE GREAT COMMANDMENT

Your group will enjoy better discussion if people don't feel pressured to answer each and every question.)

- 1. "You are worried and upset over all these details!" What details of life distract you from what is most important, and where does that lead you?
- 2. How is busyness currently affecting what you prioritize?
- 3. "There is only one thing worth being concerned about." What makes Christ the most important thing in life? Why should it matter what he says?
- 4. Look over The Great Commandment and The Great Commission. What has made these essentials challenging in your life?

PERSONAL ACTION STEP

Find a quiet moment sometime this week and ask God to calm your thoughts and feelings. Play a worship song or offer a prayer from the Pray First book, like the Daily Prayer of Surrender.

When you are ready, read and think about these two statements that Jesus gave. (The Great Commandment & The Great Commission.) Think about Jesus telling Martha that Mary had made the better choice in how she spent her time in that moment.

Tell God, "If I'm headed in the wrong direction, would you please tell me?" Ask him to lead you and correct you. Ask him to keep you from being pulled away by unimportant things.

Picture what your life would look like if you prioritized Christ and these teachings. Describe what you see.

Close your time with God by asking Him to enable you to arrange your schedule in order to hear each lesson in this series. Pray that He will better equip you to participate in what Jesus said is most important.

Ask how you can pray and support one another this week. Then, close in prayer. The Serenity Prayer may be a good closing prayer for your group this week...
