REVIEW IT

Everyone suffers, but some in the world are suffering because of their faith in Christ. The Apostle Paul makes it clear to believers in 2 Timothy 3:12 that, "Anyone who belongs to Christ Jesus and wants to live right will have trouble from others." There are three things believers can remember when they face opposition that will give them great strength: 1) Opposition can make me more like Jesus, 2) Opposition will deepen my faith, and 3) Opposition will give me eternal rewards.

The Apostle Peter wrote to the church where he gives many instructions in how to respond to the trial of persecution they were enduring. When believers face opposition, some things they can do include:

- 1. Don't be surprised (Darkness does not like light)
- 2. Don't be afraid (The love of God casts out fear)
- 3. Don't be ashamed (If you're doing what is right, know the peace of God)
- 4. Recognize the source (Look past the person to the real source of oppression)
- 5. Refuse to retaliate (You are most like Christ when you do not attack back)
- 6. Respond with a blessing (This takes great courage, and shows the love & power of God in you)

- Open your Bible to John chapter 3. Read verses 16-21. Notice verse 19. What or Who is the Light?

- Discuss in your group how you feel about the persecution of Christians around the world. How have you or anyone close to you been impacted by disapproval or rejection because of your faith?

Read Matthew 5:10-12 at the top of the page. Discuss how these verses give you hope and help you more confidently and fearlessly proclaim your Christian faith as a result.
