Another analogy for faith is that of farming. Jesus often used the laws of sowing and reaping, planting and harvesting to tell us what faith in the Kingdom of God is like. Jesus was clear that bearing fruit is the purpose of our salvation because bearing fruit brings glory to God. He wants us to bear the lasting fruit of repentance, The Spirit, sharing faith, ministry to others and generosity. How can we bear lasting fruit?

- 1. Plant good seed
- 2. Cultivate deep roots
- 3. Eliminate the weeds
- 4. Cooperate with God's pruning
- 5. Wait patiently, expecting a harvest
- 6. Plant now!
