1. Surrender my <u>LIFE</u> completely to God <u>DAILY</u>

2. Stop listening to the <u>VOICES</u> of <u>FEAR</u>

"O Sovereign Lord," I said, "I can't speak for you! I'm too young!" The Lord replied, "Don't say, 'I'm too young,' for you must go wherever I send you and say whatever I tell you. And don't be afraid of the people, for I will be with you and will protect you. I, the Lord, have spoken!" Jeremiah 1:6-8 (NLT)

3. Fill my mind with MUSIC that PRAISES God

REVIEW IT

Today, we know the Christmas story as Good News—God became flesh in order to save us from our sins. But for those who experienced the Christmas story firsthand, the news scared them to death. When you read through the Christmas account, you'll find that the characters faced four familiar fears... Mary faced the fear of **inadequacy**. Joseph faced the fear of **disapproval**. The shepherds faced the fear of **sudden change**. King Herod faced the fear of **losing control**.

If you're facing any of these fears, it doesn't mean there's something defective about you, and you can defeat them! How? 1) Surrender my life completely to God. 2) Stop listening to the voices of fear. 3) Fill my mind with music that praises God. 4) Base my hope on the promises of God.

The greatest promise that God gives us — For God so loved the world that He gave His One and Only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16 (NIV)

Spend some time in the Word: Read Psalm 23.

TALK ABOUT IT

- 1. We have the benefit of the entire Christmas story, but those who were in the middle of it experienced different levels of fear. How have the fears of inadequacy, disapproval, sudden change, or losing control affected your joy? Looking back with a bigger perspective, what did those fears cost you?
- 2. The world wants you to live with a spirit of fear, but fear goes against God. What are some things you need to stop listening to in 2024 that are distracting you from trusting God?
- 3. "The God who never changes... changes everything." Often, the change can be surprising and can interrupt your plans. How can trusting in God *before* the unexpected help to prepare your heart and mind? How can trusting God *in the middle* of the unexpected see you through?
- 4. In this busy Christmas season, what can you do to keep the focus off of yourself, or things of this world, and put the focus back on the real reason for this season Jesus Christ?

ACT ON IT

God keeps His promises. If you have not yet trusted in the greatest promise that we were given in John 3:16, what fear is keep you from this? Start there. If you have already trusted in God for your salvation, grab hold of another promise that God gives in His Word. Write it on a sticky note and claim it for your life.

PRAY ABOUT IT

Thank God for His promises. If you know what fear is holding you back, bring that fear before God and ask for His help. If you are unsure, simply come before God and seek His presence. God is with you always.
