REVIEW IT

The disciple, John, gave us the world's value system when he wrote that "everything in the world the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world." Temptations come in a variety of expressions, but at their core, every temptation comes from one of these three values. The lust of the flesh is the desire to indulge. The lust of the eyes is the desire to increase. The pride of life is the desire to impress. So, what are the values that counter culture?

- 3. Humility comes from the word humus. Meaning of the earth. Who is a humble person you know? Read James 4:6-10. Why is it a good idea to serve with humility?
