At that time the Roman emperor, <u>Augustus</u>, decreed that a census should be taken throughout the <u>Roman Empire</u>. ² (This was the first census taken when <u>Quirinius</u> was governor of <u>Syria</u>.) ³ All returned to their <u>own ancestral towns</u> to register for this census. ⁴ And because <u>Joseph</u> was a descendant of <u>King David</u>, he had to go to <u>Bethlehem</u> in <u>Judea</u>, David's ancient home. He traveled there from the village of <u>Nazareth</u> in <u>Galilee</u>. ⁵ He took with him <u>Mary</u>, to whom he was engaged, who was now expecting a child.

REVIEW IT

Sometimes we can consider ourselves so smart and clever, we miss the big point. Don't miss the point of Christmas: If we did not so desperately need a Savior, Jesus would not have come to the world humbly as He did, suffered as He did, dying as He did, and rising from the dead as He did. Christmas is God intersecting with humanity — at just the right time. God's plans reveal a specific place, time, and purpose.

Things work better when they are in the right place. The nativity scene depicts Jesus at the right place... in the center. When we put anything else in the center of our life (work, our own wisdom, distractions, family, and even religion) our life doesn't work right. This does not mean that you are guaranteed a trial free life, but rather a joy in the middle of the trials because of God's presence.

Common places in our life become holy at the right time. While we don't know when the next holy moment will be, we must remain ready. When we draw near to God, He draws near to us — and our everyday places become where invite the presence of God into our lives. **The right time is now.**

TALK ABOUT IT

- 1. So much of life is being in the right place at the right time. Share with the group a time where this was true for you. What emotions did you experience? How many people did you share this story with right after it happened?
- 2. The world can influence us to shift what is at the center of our lives. If you are in a season in which Jesus is not at the center, what has taken His place? Even if what is currently in the center can be considered a "good" thing, it does not bring the joy-filled, full life with Jesus in the center. What can you do to return Jesus to His rightful place?
- 3. Emmanuel means God with us. What common, everyday places in your life need to become a holy place because of God's presence? What can God do to the tension that you are experiencing in those areas?

ACT ON IT

When we draw near to God, He draws near to us. Bring a Bible or devotional book with you to work or your child's practice. Study God's Word; learn His promises. When you invite God into all areas of your life, tension and stress will be reduced.

PRAY ABOUT IT

Thank God for sending His Son, Jesus, to be our Savior. Ask God to forgive you for putting something other than Jesus in the center of your life. Commit to progress, not perfection, in making the commonplace areas of your life holy.
