REVIEW IT

A marriage is a living, breathing, covenant relationship. As with anything living... just because it's existing, doesn't mean it's growing. Unfortunately, in our culture we can easily pick up lies and attitudes that stunt the growth of our marriages. Here are four: 1) "I can change him/her." The truth is, we are to submit to one another as we surrender to God who uses marriage to make us less selfish. 2) "A good marriage is always 50/50." The truth is, when you think marriage is 50/50, you end up keeping score. When you keep score, you both lose. A good marriage is modeled after how Christ loved the Church. 100%. 3) "This one little thing isn't a big thing." However, it's rarely big problems alone that keep a marriage from growing. It's little things that go unchecked. 4) "There's no hope for my marriage." But, with God, there's always hope.

So, what are some actions that can keep a marriage growing?

1. Hurry home 4. Throw away the parachute

2. Nourish romance 5. Apply Bible passages to you both as a couple

3. Celebrate differences 6. Trust God's Spirit who unites you
