REVIEW IT

A financial storm is upon us. We don't always understand what causes it, but God can use storms to guide us back to him and have us rely on him more deeply. Using the story of the Prodigal Son, we learn how we become consumed with financial stress and how we can be freed from it. Just like the Prodigal, we are stressed when: we engage in self-destructive behavior, when we are consumed with having more, when we want everything now, when we spend everything we have. We are left unprepared for storms.

In Isaiah 9:6 Jesus is called the Prince of Peace. Lord and peace go hand in hand. Where he is Lord in life, then you will have peace. The Prince of Peace has principles of peace. Contentment, dependence, integrity, generosity, trust. When we repent and turn back to our Father just as the Prodigal Son chose to do, we can experience peace.
