"Live By Faith, Not By Sight!"

We live in a culture that has a lot to say about what faith is:

- Faith in faith it doesn't matter what you believe in as long as you are sincere.
- Faith is personal and has only the meaning you give it.

We have decided to live by faith, not by sight!

Review - we unpacked what faith is biblically.

- Remember contend for "the faith" that was once for all delivered to the saints (Jude 3)—
 right doctrine.
- Remember faith is to believe He is, and He blesses those who diligently seek Him (*Hebrews* 11:6).
- Remember real faith leads to obedience (*Romans 1:5, James 2:14*).
- Remember faith is to believe Him—who He says He is, what He says He has done, and that He will do what He says He will do.

Romans 4:1-3 (NIV) ¹What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, discovered in this matter? ² If, in fact, Abraham was justified by works, he had something to boast about—but not before God. ³ What does Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.

But we live in a world that will challenge our faith and even cause doubt.

- 1. Doubting is a normal part of our lives.
- 2. The apostle's doubted their mission without Jesus. Their even doubted after seeing with their own eyes—was this real?
- 3. Sometimes we doubt ourselves.
- 4. Sometimes we doubt God when we don't understand what is happening.
- 5. We doubt because we are strangers in the world. Everyone believes something different than us and we feel different, and are tempted to just get along and go along.

<u>Matthew 14:31 (NIV)</u> ³¹Immediately Jesus reached out His hand and caught him. "You of little faith," He said, "why did you doubt?"

Matthew 11:2–6 (NIV) ²When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples ³to ask Him, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?" ⁴Jesus replied, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: ⁵The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. ⁶Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of Me."

Matthew 28:16-18 (NIV); Mark 9:24 (NASB95)

Much of the New Testament was written to help believers overcome doubt.

<u>1 Peter 4:1–5 (NIV)</u> ¹ Therefore, since Christ suffered in His body, arm yourselves also with the same attitude, because whoever suffers in the body is done with sin. ²As a result, they do not live the rest of their earthly lives for evil human desires, but rather for the will of God. ³ For you have spent enough time in the past doing what pagans choose to do—living in debauchery, lust, drunkenness, orgies, carousing and detestable idolatry. ⁴ They are surprised that you do not join them in their reckless, wild living, and they heap abuse on you. ⁵ But they will have to give account to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead.

Jude 3 (NIV) ³Dear friends, although I was very eager to write to you about the salvation we share, I felt compelled to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to God's holy people.

- 4. How has obeying God helped your own personal faith grow?
- 5. We are commanded to go and make disciples. Who has done that for you, and how are you doing that with others?
- 6. God promised to be with us until the end of the age. How do you feel His presence in your own life? Starting a new LIFEgroup might be a good next step for you to start making disciples.
