The Great Exchange: Week 2



April 9th, 2023

"A God Who Surprises!"

We have been looking at the scene from the Upper Room.

- Context: the Jews were expecting the Messiah.
- Jesus comes into town on a donkey (see Zechariah 9:9)—so far, so good.

Message 1: A God Who Serves. He's unexpected, and very surprising.

- Look at what they expected (the Jewish Messiah) versus what they got (God's Messiah).
- Jesus **surprised** the disciples by washing their feet. Jesus **exchanged** the way others live and led with a new way full of humility.

This Week's Message 2: A God Who Surprises. The empty tomb changed everything!

- God exchanges death for life.
- God authenticates Jesus; He declares who Jesus is by raising Him from the dead.
- God declares that the price is paid and accepted for those who believe.

Luke 24:1–8 ¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here; He has risen! Remember how He told you, while He was still with you in Galilee: ⁷'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." ⁸Then they remembered His words.

GOD SURPRISES AT THE UPPER ROOM AND BY THE SEA OF GALILEE.

- · Jesus affirms those who had denied Him.
- God's grace is surprising.
- See John 21:15-19 where Jesus is re-affirming Peter.

Luke 24:36–49 ³⁶While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." ⁴⁰When He had said this, He showed them His hands and feet. ⁴¹And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, He asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" ⁴²They gave Him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and He took it and ate it in their presence. ⁴⁴He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." ⁴⁵Then He opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

THE RESULT: THE DISCIPLES LIVED SURPRISING LIVES.

- The disciples became servants of others. They were known for their love.
- The disciples (early Christians) lived for different goals—they lived for Jesus.
- The disciples were committed to the new Kingdom. Whatever nationality, or race, or kingdom (nation) someone was from was secondary. God's Kingdom is a Holy (set apart) nation.
- The world can seem like it is out of control, and that God is at the mercy of evil people. This
 is simply not true.
- Death isn't what we thought it was. It's a doorway.
- They had courage and purpose in the face of trial, even unto death.
- Knowing God serves, saves, and surprises leads us to a surprising lifestyle.
- Colossians 2:13-15; 1 Corinthians 15:1-6, 14-21.

- Look at the way you live.
- What do you live for?
- Are you surprising?

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS IN LIFE GROUP OR WITH FAMILY AND FRIENDS:

Passages to consider: John 20.

- 1. What impacted you or surprised you about Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection as you heard it this year?
- 2. Read John 20:10-18, or John 20:19-22, or John 20:24-30. What is surprising in this passage? How do you see the people respond to Jesus?
- 3. What surprises you about God these days? Where is there awe? Where might there be doubt?
- 4. So far, *The Great Exchange* has looked at the God who *serves* and who *surprises*. What has God shown you about Himself in this season? How is that impacting how you respond to life?
- 5. Who, in your world, needs to know this amazing God and His good news? What is your part in sharing Him with them?
