1. Nehemiah's concern for Gods people - Gods plan.

- His first question How are Gods people?
- Nehemiah 1:1–3

2. Nehemiah's reaction – a broken heart and seeking God in prayer.

- Why? Did the wall bother him?
- Confession
- Nehemiah 1:4

3. Nehemiah risks his life and his comfort.

- Does what God has put on His heart. **Nehemiah 2:12**
- He risked his life.
- He is willing to do the hard work.
- He is willing to face the enemies of God.
- Nehemiah 2:1–3

4. Nehemiah and leadership – leading my home and church.

- A. He calls their attention to the broken wall and what it means.
 - Nehemiah 2:17–18
- **B.** He calls everyone to work.
- **C.** The opposition ridicules them.
 - Nehemiah 4:1
- **D.** Focus Work and defend at the same time. Remember who is on our side.
 - Nehemiah 4:13–17
- **E.** Rally for your people, blow the trumpet!
 - Rally to each other.
 - Blow the trumpet if you are in trouble.
 - Nehemiah 4:19–21

- Malachi 1:6: Blemished sacrifices.
- Malachi 3:6: Robbing God.
- Malachi 2:10: Marriage, family and relationships broken.
