What does verse 3 tell us about Obadiah?

The main characteristic of evil is to put out the light of righteousn Verse 4

Romans 1:29 – 32

Obadiah found a way to thread the needle between righteousnes: working for a wicked leader.

Jeremiah 2:19 2nd Chronicles 7:14

What a contrast between Obadiah and Elijah. 2nd Corinthians 6:17 Psalms 1:1 – 3

Verse 5 – 6 King Ahab cared more for his animals than his people.

Verses 7 – 8 Obadiah meets Elijah.

Verses 9 – 14 Reveal Obadiah's fear.

Verses 15 – 16 Obadiah's fear did not move Elijah.
